

# Spencer Grove is name chosen for new home

**AS part of its policy of involving local people in decision making, Milford Care invited members of the Belper Cottage Project Luncheon Club and Belper 50+ Forum to come up with a name for their new Belper facility.**

The £5 million development on Spencer Road in Belper involves converting the former hosiery factory into a splendid 57 bedroom care home for the elderly with a roof garden and panoramic views over the valley.

It will also have on the site 30 close care retirement apartments. They are expected to be ready for occupation in the summer and the care home will be known as Spencer Grove.

Pierre Falleth, of Milford Care, said: "The policy at our care homes is to fully involve residents in the decision making process.

"As we clearly do not have any residents at the new facility we involved instead the local Luncheon Club, Belper's 50 + Forum, the local history society and also the residents and relatives at Milford House. In total more than 100 people took part.

"The ladies and gentlemen of the Luncheon Club decided to name the new care home Spencer Grove and we are all delighted.

"It is interesting that two of the five ladies who came up with the name, Edna Binning and Margaret Wingfield, both worked at the site when it was Blounts
